2020 Camogie Report.

At the beginning of the season, the plan was that Camogie would complete 6 weeks indoor training beginning in February and then moving to outdoor training at the end of April. Unfortunately our training season was interrupted by the Covid19 restrictions.

Following the Return to Play Guidelines issued by the GAA, Camogie resumed training on Friday 3rd July - initially with the older girls though all age groups were back at training within a few weeks. The number of girls attending training has been constant every week. The level of compliance to the health guidelines of all that attended training has to be complimented.

Our training sessions have been well supported by players, coaches and parents. For the U6 to U10 Camogs attended our last training session on Friday 9th October. It was planned that the U12/14 Camogs would continue until end October but we had to cease training due to Covid restrictions.

The high turnout (of excess 70 girls) to training every week reflects the enthusiasm of the girls and the commitment of the coaches to camogie in Warrenpoint.

2020 U6 Camogie Season Report..

U6 Camogs resumed indoor training in January on Fridays - this was in conjunction with the U7 Hurlers. Outdoor training for this age group restarted at the end July. As there were no County blitzes scheduled this season, the coaches arranged a number of challenge matches - some of which had to be cancelled/rescheduled as restrictions were updated. Our very young U6 team accepted the invitation from Mayobridge to visit for a challenge match.

2020 U8 Camogie Season Report

Despite the circumstances 2020 has brought to underage camogie the under 8 girls were delighted to be back training mid-July. Each week we had a great turn out at training. Within the 15 weeks the girls completed a selection of skill drills and had matches with Castlewellan, Mayobridge and Ballela. During these matches the girls put their camogie skills into action. By the end of the 15 weeks you could see the improvement in each player. We had a great season and are looking forward to 2021.

2020 U10 Camogie Season Report..

The U10 girls (and their coaches) were delighted to resume training in July. The Camogs completed a very busy training schedule even though there were no County Blitzes scheduled this season. Challenge matches were arranged with the neighbouring clubs Mayobridge, Castlewellan and Attical.

The coaches are very proud of how the girls' skills and confidence have continued to develop and grow. This is very evident in their performances during matches. We are hoping that 2021 brings less disruption to training and matches as we are keen to build upon the experiences of this year.

2020 U12/14 Camogie Season Report..

At the beginning of 2020 it was agreed that our U12 Camogs would amalgamate with Attical U12 as our numbers for this age group were low. It was hoped that this amalgamated team would enter the U12 County league. This partnership did not happen due to the Covid restrictions, so our U12 girls played up with our U14 team.

This was the first year since Camogie resumed in CPN that we had an U14 team available to take part in league and championship. In the league we played three matches against Newry Shamrocks, Attical and Bredagh.

During our championship efforts the hurling cohort came on board to help with coaching this age group. Their match experiences were very informative for developing the girls skills and match confidence. We hope to continue to progress with the relationship with hurling for 2021.
