Camogie Report 2024

Overview of year

We have seen another exceptional year as camogie continues to grow within the club, well over 100 girls are now playing camogie. Since re-establishment, this year has seen our first fully independent team play 15 a side and above Go Games, which is huge achievement for a developing camogie club. We attended and hosted several blitzes over the season, with a lot of effort from our coaching team. We have also had several interventions from the county Development Officer Sean Coulter, and we will continue to utilise this resource next season as much as possible.

We continue to have to both loan out and amalgamate at our older age groups, however, next season we will be fielding both U16 and U14 full sided teams, leaving only a small number of players needing temporary transfers outside of the club. It is still our vision to be to field at senior level in the coming years, target year being 2027. In order to be successful and competitive at these levels it is imperative that we grow our coaching/administrative staff, which currently sits at 14, however, after a successful recruitment meeting, we hope to double this for 2025.

As detailed in the age group reports we, as we do every year, took a bus to the All Ireland Camogie Finals, where our U12s had the privilege of playing at half time, fantastic day out.

We continue to drive the presence of camogie within the club and have had a series of very successful fundraising events, both for players (sponsored walk) and parents (quiz), raising money for both the club and the county. We hope to continue these initiatives next season.

The county board has struggled this season, both for volunteers and financially. The county were very thankful for our engagement with the fundraiser and my help with the fundraising committee.

This year we continued to amalgamate with Shamrocks at this age level, as this is where our numbers were low, with only 4 players. This was a difficult year for these girls as they were entered into a small sided league with only one other team. However, they won all matches that they played, and some of our U14s were given the opportunity to play up, giving them some stretch from both a physical and skill perspective. The amalgamation will not continue into next year as we will have a full sided U16 team of our own. We aim to training U14/16 together next year at Milltown (bigger pitch), which will allow us to combine our coaching resources.

U12 Camogie section had 15 girls enrolled for the 2024 season. The girls undergone a training plan aimed at developing core camogie skills which the girls stuck too and improved as the season went on.

They attended two scheduled blitz's. One in Clonduff mid-April and the other in Kilcoo mid-September. The girls had the opportunity to play teams who were not scheduled in their league.

The league was split up into two sections- first ran from end May to end of June and the girls had the opportunity to play 4 teams. The second ran from start of Aug to mid-September and we played 5 teams. The girls had exposure to more game time this season which will stand by them as the majority will move to U14 for the upcoming 2025 Season.

The highlight of the year was attending the Camogie finals in Croke Park in August. This was extra special as our U12 Camogs were selected to play at half time Senior Final against Douglas GAA, Cork.
