It was year of mixed fortunes and emotions for the club, from the sadness at the death of our esteemed senior committee member Aisling McGivern to the satisfaction and pride of our senior ladies winning the Down Junior Championship and reaching the Ulster Final for the first time in our history.

Only a month ago we laid to rest our Senior Committee member and close friend to many, Aisling McGivern.

Aisling played a central leadership role in every aspect of club life. Her input and commitment was enormous, invaluable, and sincerely appreciated by all.

Aisling was very active in Scor from an early age and throughout her life, indeed just two weeks before she passed away, she attended an Irish dancing event in Letterkenny. Aisling was also known by many across the club and county as a driving force with regards to organising fundraising and social events. She was also to the fore within the club when new initiatives were rolled out within the GAA, for example, Operation Transformation, and other Health & Wellbeing projects. Perhaps her main forte was in the field of communication both on a personal one-one level and with the advent of social media she was a trailblazer both at club and county level.

Aislings contribution to our club and the wider community, as well as the esteem within which her family is held, was evident by the enormity of her wake and funeral. Since I joined senior committee a long time ago Aisling was always there for me when I needed help, she was always there to give me advice and there to keep me and everyone else in line, as and when required (and sometimes when not required). But most importantly she was a great friend and will be sorely missed.

Prior to this, in September, we lost another ex-committee member, Tommy Daly, who also contributed massively to our Club and County.

Tommy came to Warrenpoint almost 15 years ago, and from the start energised Hurling within our club. As a player, he was pivotal in the winning of the Junior Championship in 2022. As a coach, he was always on hand to spread knowledge and enthusiasm for the game he loved. His passion for GAA, Hurling, playing and most importantly for teaching, inspiring and leading our young gaels will inspire us in the years to come. He will be sorely missed by all and no words will ever do justice to the long lasting legacy Tommy leaves behind in Warrenpoint.

Off the field the club continues to be equally busy. I'm sure everyone is aware of the work that has commenced on the new field at Pairc Liam Ui Ir, these are exciting times and we expect the new pitch to be available for club teams from April 2026. Thanks to Feargal and the 'Our Vision' project team working tirelessly to get this off the ground. More still needs to be done so we need our members to be patient and supportive as this project enters its next phase.
